WRGN's time and temperature sign broke a new record for us on Friday, July 22 as it reached 107 degrees!

It was nearly a record setting day, although not quite as warm as our time and temperature sign proclaimed. When the sun shines all day, the afternoon temperature on the sign tends to read 5-6 degrees higher than the actual temperature. The sign did generate a lot of interest though, as drivers stopped to take a picture of the triple digit temperature readings.

The day's record tied the previous record for July 22 of 98 degrees set back in 1955, although listener and volunteer Elsie Mahoney remembers a heat wave in 1936 that she says was

just as hot. That was long before they started keeping local records in 1955.

The temperature was warm enough to cause some difficulties at our main transmitter site in Sweet Valley. An exhaust fan motor burned out from running continuously trying to keep up with the heat, which in turn caused the transmitter to overheat and shut down. Fortunately, Burl Updyke had a spare motor on the shelf at the transmitter building and quick work by Jonathan Broscious and Tim Madeira had WRGN transmitting at full power once again in about 15 minutes.
