To the WRGN listening family,

One of the things I love about the way Jesus taught is that he used everyday objects to teach a lesson. It helped his disciples to not just hear, but understand what he was teaching. Many of those examples were drawn from agriculture, such as when he told the disciples *"I am the vine, you are the branches..."* (John 15).

Recently, as I was taking the garbage out (yes, we can learn lessons from garbage!), I began to think about the bags I was carrying. On Wednesday, July 19, a powerful storm moved through the Hunlock Creek area. WRGN was off the air for almost 6 hours. WRGN's general manager had been in Bear Creek having dinner when he heard news of the power outage that had taken WRGN's signal off the air. Once he arrived at the WRGN studios, however, he found that the situation was much more than a simple power outage!

Our computer which runs the station during the overnight hours and the weekends was damaged, as well as an entire channel on WRGN's audio board. Another piece of equipment, a satellite receiver, which stores many of our programs such as *Love Worth Finding*, *Insight For Living*, and *Focus on the Family* was also damaged. We currently have a loaner piece of equipment until our own unit can be repaired and put back into operation. Thank you to all of our listeners who were praying for us during a stressful time!

Our promotions director, Laura Madeira, was away for most of July on a missions trip to the Czech

Republic with Fellowship Church. This was Laura's second trip to the Czech Republic. Laura's first week was filled with training and preparation for the second week, which included teaching English at a camp for teens.

The Czech Republic was dominated by Christianity until at least the first half of the 20th century; since then it has steadily declined and today has one of the least religious populations in the world. Laura had countless opportunities to engage in conversation about faith and is thankful for the work God did in students' hearts.

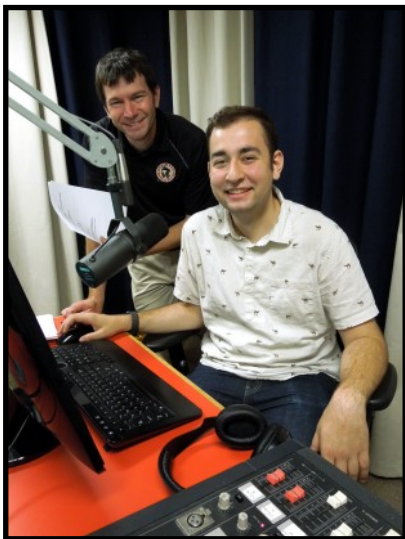
Favorite Christian band or concert?

Thanks, Nick! We wish you the best as you head back to school in a few weeks and we're glad to have had the opportunity to work with you this summer! All the best!

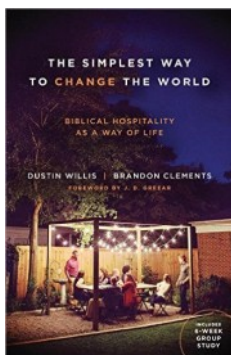


New at the Library
