The radio is AC operated and may be used anywhere in the home where there is a good internet signal. It is very easy to use, and does not require a computer. It costs approximately \$140 and no monthly fees are required. Anyone with internet service in their home will

find this the answer to listening to WRGN's broadcasts anywhere they may live, even in other states. "It took some time to develop a practical unit, but this has been accomplished," said Burl Updyke, WRGN manger. He is very excited about what this development can mean in spreading the gospel of Christ over the airwaves. It is perfect for those who live away from the area during the winter months.
