To the WRGN listening family,

Why do you do what you do? Of the thousands of possible professions out there, why did you choose what you now do? Maybe, like me, you feel like your profession chose you. The fact is, it doesn't matter so much **WHAT** we do as **WHO** we do it for! 1 Corinthians 10:31 says, *“So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.”*

If you have any teens in your life, you know that the last few years of high school are challenging ones. They are trying to figure out what it is they will do with the rest of their lives. We would do well to advise them from this passage in Corinthians. **The fact is, the world will offer them advice in direct opposition to this passage, because the world tends to focus on self, not others.** Looking back in this passage from 1 Corinthians 10, Paul gives the exact opposite advice in verse 24 when he says, *“Let no one seek his own good, but the good of his neighbor.”* Wow! What would happen if we let that verse change our perspective on what we do and how we do it!

I was reminded of this recently during *Wake Up Right* as I heard *Breakpoint*, one of the many daily short programs interspersed with our music. In it, John Stonestreet paraphrased T. S. Eliott with this statement: *“Our idols make us think less about God, and at the same time, make us think about God less.”* Can what we do become an idol? Yes, anything that takes the place of God in our lives, even our profession, can become an idol. **That's why we must continuously commit to doing what we do to the glory of God and for others!** Let's change our perspective and our purpose.




New at the Library




It's the month of June and school is almost out for everyone! It's a great time to stop by the Good News Library and pick up some books for your summer reading, whether the books are for your reading pleasure or maybe required reading lists for school! The Good News Library is open weekdays 9-4:30 and books may be borrowed for 30 days and audiobooks and DVDs for 2 weeks.

Just in time for Father's Day is a new book from author Steve Graves, **41 Deposits: Crucial Conversations for Fathers and Sons** and is published by B&H Publishing Group. When Steve Graves' son began his high school journey, he saw an opportunity to give him something he'd never gotten before—a series of intentional "life deposits," crucial conversations that could help guide him into adulthood. Steve began a personal journal about the critical lessons he wanted to share with his son. Then he and Kile discussed those lessons over bagels while meeting regularly over the next three years.



41 Deposits shares the lessons Steve felt were important to him and his son so that other fathers and sons can learn and apply those lessons to their own lives and relationships. Each chapter includes a story that drives home a specific deposit, followed by key insights to consider and questions to ask and answer. This very personal account of the investments Steve made with his son provides a blueprint for other fathers who are on a similar journey.

For our younger readers, there's a new book in the library called **Why God? Big Answers About God and Why We Believe in Him** from Dan DeWitt. Thomas loves to think about silly questions. (Are bats really mice with wings?) But other questions are humdingers . . . like when Thomas wonders, Why God? Why do we believe in Him? That's when he and his sister, Hope, must go in search of a humdinger of an answer. Come along as they discover the clues God has given us to help us know how real and wonderful He truly is.



Written by Dan DeWitt, an apologetics professor with a love for stories, **Why God?** takes apologetics and makes it accessible for children, not only answering their questions but also opening their hearts to the wonders of God.
