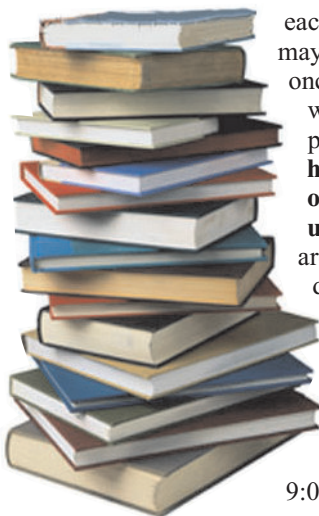

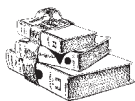

What's in a name?

By now I'm sure you have heard of the passing of Chuck Colson, host of BreakPoint, heard daily here on WRGN. **Colson's name became a household word in the mid 1970's as a result of his involvement with the Watergate scandal.** His name and reputation were dragged through the mud, something he admitted he deserved. Proverbs 22:1 says *"A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, loving favor rather than silver and gold."*

So can a bad name be redeemed? God, through His grace, showed it is possible! After reading C.S. Lewis' book, *Mere Christianity*, Chuck Colson went from hatchet man to heavenly warrior. There were those at the time who said his conversion was simply a ploy to get out of serving prison time. As the years passed, it became clear that his change was a heart change. In fact, God gave Colson a heart to found Prison Fellowship as a result of the need he saw while doing his time in prison.

As Christians, we bear the name of Christ, and 1 Peter 4:12-14 tells us *"do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; but rejoice...If you are reproached for the name of Christ, blessed are you..."*

Are you blessed to bear His name? **Do you have a heart for those around you, to see them redeemed by the name of Christ?** At WRGN, we do, and we are grateful for those of you who partner with us to lift up that name above all names, Jesus!
