Share-A-Thon 2011





It was another busy month here at the WRGN studios as Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee kept us busy! The effects of Irene's storm damage left us without power for two days as many trees were toppled due to the wind and water-logged ground. Tim and Jonathan worked to get a generator going that hadn't been used in nearly 15 years. After working on the unit all day, they finally got it started and took it up to the transmitter site in Sweet Valley. They made all of the necessary connections, turned it on and WRGN was back on the air! Then, less than 30 seconds later, the actual electricity came back on! Some of our listeners were without power for the entire week.

The following week, remnants of Tropical Storm Lee brought heavy rains to the area and caused the evacuation of residents from the Wyoming Valley whose properties had been affected by the Agnes flood in 1972.

Jonathan and Tim pre-empted regular programming or broke in as necessary to give WRGN listeners the latest information on road closings and evacuation information. Jonathan also interviewed Luzerne County Commissioner Maryanne Petrilla and Steve Urban several times to get the most up-to-date information. arranged to carry the live feed from Governor Tom Corbett's press conference in Forty Fort. Throughout the ordeal we tried to give our listeners the latest information while also playing encouraging music and inspirational programs.

Throughout the month of September we heard from ten new listeners from WRGN and eight new listeners from

the West Indies. With all of the rainy days we'd been having in Northeastern Pennsylvania, Jonathan enjoyed talking to our WIVH listeners to get their weather reports of sunshine and warm temperatures!

One of those new callers was Andrew Fisher from East Earl in Lancaster County. He is a service technician for Turkey Hill and was driving through the area and scanned the dial to find a good station! We spoke with Stephen from Wilkes-Barre who works for Pride Mobility and travels around the country for Pride's national seminars. He loves seeing how his company's products help people regain their independence. Stephen has been listening to WRGN for nineteen years!
