We are also celebrating our teen readers this month with the theme "Teens Read" highlighting teen fiction and non-fiction. Stop by the Good News Library and check out the thousands of resources the Library has to offer.

Cindy Beall's new book is *Rebuilding a Marriage Better Than New* and she shares from her redeemed-marriage journey to help you trust completely in God's ability and grace, heal deeply by restoring faith in a future, build wisely from the foundation up, live fully by embracing your renewed relationship, and invest generously in your marriage and in other people.

Wake Up Right co-host Tim Madeira interviewed Timothy Keller last month about his latest book, Making Sense of God: An Invitation to the Skeptical. Our society places such faith in empirical reason, historical progress, and heartfelt emotion that it's easy to wonder: What role can faith and religion play in our modern lives? Pastor and author Timothy Keller invites skeptics to consider that Christianity is more relevant now than ever.

Readers of Amish fiction will want to check out *Mattie's Pledge* by Jan Drexler. Mattie Schrock is no stranger to uprooting her life. Even as her father relocated her family from one Amish community to the next, she always managed to find a footing in their new homes. As her family plans to move west, she looks forward to connecting with Jacob Yoder, who has always held a special place in her heart. When a handsome Englisher tempts her to leave the Amish behind to search for adventure in the West, will her pledge to Jacob be the anchor that holds her

secure?

Preschool and early readers will enjoy the book Roxy the Ritzy Camel by Anthony Destefano, demonstrating the familiar Bible verse: "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." Readers will learn that possessions are only things and definitely NOT the most important things. With bright illustrations and engaging, funny rhyme, this storybook follows Roxy's journey from her waterless home in the desert to a great city of beauty she's heard about but has never seen. Along the way she learns that the only way to attain true happiness is to share—or even give away—what she possesses.

From the college classroom of the movie, *God's Not Dead*, to the public square in the sequel God's Not Dead 2, the name of Jesus is welcomed less and less with each passing day. If Christians don't take a stand today, will we even have a choice tomorrow? Welcome back to Hope Springs where beloved teacher Grace Wesley helps students understand and enjoy history. Her love of teaching. her love for her students, and her love of life all come from the same place: her love of Christ. When Brooke, a hurting student grieving the loss of her brother, reaches out to Grace, their coffee-shop conversation naturally leads to Grace sharing the hope she finds in Christ. When Brooke later asks an honest question about Jesus in the classroom, Grace's response lands her in big trouble. Grace faces an epic court case that could not only cost her the career she loves but expel God from the classroom—and the public square—once and for all!
