This affected not just the USVI, but other islands in the Caribbean, including Puerto Rico. The damage to WIVH is detailed on the facing page. WIVH damaged by Hurricane Maria



The Caribbean has suffered a one-two punch starting with Hurricane Irma, which devastated the islands of St. Thomas and St. John, followed by Hurricane Maria less than two weeks later that similarly devastated St. Croix. Hurricane Maria also caused flooding on the already ravaged St. Thomas, further damaging many homes which had lost roofs in the first hurricane.

WIVH was able to remain on the air throughout the entirety of Hurricane Irma, but was not so fortunate during Hurricane Maria, which left the entire island of St. Croix without power, most of which is still without power to this day.

Lack of power is not the

only issue. The cable that feeds the WIVH signal to the antenna on the tower came loose in the high winds. The winds also twisted our satellite dish on its axis and knocked down the mast for the small microwave dish that sends our signal to the tower.

The building that houses the studios and our missionary operators was also damaged, losing a portion of its roof to the Category 5 winds. (see aerial picture above taken days after the hurricane).

The roof has been covered with a tarp, and work is being done to restore WIVH to the airwaves. A work team will need to be formed in the near future to make more permanent repairs to the studios.

HERE AT THE STUDIOS

What a wonderful beginning to fall! September seemed more like the middle of summer if you looked at the thermometer! But here at WRGN, we certainly knew it was fall because of See You at the Pole! WRGN partnered with the National Network of Youth Ministries and local youth pastors to sponsor a day-long conference, Dare 2 Share LIVE, which was simulcast from Colorado, Cross Creek Community Church, Trucksville, was one of 67 locations across the country carrying the simulcast. Teens attending the event were trained share their faith with their fellow students. They were also given the opportunity to go door-to-door and collect pantry items for the Keystone Mission in Wilkes-Barre and Scranton as well as begin gospel conversations.

On Wednesday morning, September 27, Tim and Doug changed their focus from helping listeners to Wake Up Right to being inspired by students from across the WRGN listening area who had called in from their school flagpoles. We heard from hundreds of students who represented nearly 20 schools and we know that more students were present at schools that we didn't even hear from! We were encouraged by the group of students who turned out to pray at Dallas High School even though they didn't have school due to a teachers' strike. Many homeschooled students and their parents joined us outside the WRGN studio for prayer, scripture reading, and a time of worship before enjoying a pancake and sausage breakfast.

Tim & Heather Madeira and Laura Madeira enjoyed attending the We Are Messengers concert at Bethany Wesleyan Church, Cherryville. It's always a blessing to visit at the church and hear from our Lehigh Valley listeners. One man introduced himself to Tim and shared that he loves starting his day with WRGN but he was disappointed that Doug was not along so that he could meet him as well! We had a chance to catch up with Sandy who has retired and now only catches the third hour of *Wake Up Right*. The ministry of WIVH was blessed as well from the folks at Bethany Wesleyan as they took a special offering for our sister station in the Virgin Islands (see complete story on page 3).

Fall doesn't just bring a change to the color of the leaves but it usually means a few programming changes in the radio world as well. Praise and worship music hosted by Jon Gauger will replace Roger Bassick's Music Through the Night on Friday and Saturday overnights. The music will be vertical in nature, leading the listener to more focused attention upon the Lord with praise anthems sung in churches across the globe. Another new addition will be Legacy Moment hosted by Crawford Loritts at 8:20 am and 4:15 pm. Legacy *Moment*, a daily 2-minute radio program explores specific principles in a biblical context that applies to everyday life. Dr. Loritts encourages listeners to pursue a life that counts for Christ and His cause and begin a "Legacy Moment" that will last for generations to come.

Make plans to visit the Good News Library during October as we celebrate its 15th Anniversary. Special thanks to Shirley Updyke, co-founder of WRGN, for having the insight and desire to start a Christian lending library as part of the ministry of WRGN!



The Good News Library celebrates its 15th anniversary this month! Join us for cake and punch on Friday, October 27 as we celebrate 15 years of the library!




Reformation 500 by Ray Van Neste and J. Michael Garrett celebrates the Reformation and probes the ways it has shaped our world for the better. With essays from an array of disciplines, this book explores the impact of the Reformation across a wide range of human experience.

In the DVD, *Luther: The Life and Legacy of the German Reformer,* viewers will discover the story behind the man who sparked the Protestant Reformation. Told through a seamless combination of live-action storytelling and artistic animation. Martin Luther's daring life is presented in extensive detail while still making the film relevant, provocative, and accessible.

R.C. Sproul's children's book, **The Barber Who Wanted to Pray**, tells about Master Peter who is a barber well known to all in his village. One day, when Martin Luther, the Reformer, walks into his shop, the barber musters up the courage to ask the outlawed monk how to pray. Dr. Luther responds by writing a letter to the barber. The barber's life is changed as he encounters a model for prayer by using the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and the Apostles' Creed. R. C. Sproul's beautifully illustrated story will engage children and help them learn to pray according to the Bible.










Ministry Fair at Misericordia
