To the WRGN listening family,

It's amazing to me how quickly visibility can decrease as we hit those foggy spots while driving! Sometimes the changes and stresses in our lives can cause a spiritual fog. It can cause us to be very short-sighted in God's ability to work in our lives.

Like a series of gray and rainy days can make us almost forget what the warmth of the sun feels like, a period of spiritual struggle can bring on a feeling of emptiness or even deep depression. In Psalm 13:1, David cries out to God, "How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever?" 
New at the Library
